



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
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Introduction



The bats and birds have been sharing this home since 1966, when the first cave swallows arrived at Carlsbad Cavern. To know why this is unusual, we need to learn more about bats and birds.

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What Do Bats and Birds Look Like? Bats have furry bodies with short legs and feet. Some bats have weak legs and don't use them to walk. But all bats use their legs and feet to hang


from branches and rocks. Each foot has five toes and claws that help them to grip when they are hanging upside down.
