In single-syllable words, the ending *-al* has a short-*a* sound and says /ă/. In multisyllabic words, the ending *-al* has a schwa sound and says /ə/.

Example: *final*

A **schwa** /ə/ is a vowel sound similar to the short-*u* sound in *up*. It is found only in unaccented syllables of multisyllabic words.

In single-syllable words, the ending *-ic* has a short-*i* sound and says /ik/. In multisyllabic words, the ending *-ic* also has a short-*i* sound and says /ik/.
