## -al

In single-syllable words, the ending -al has a short-a sound and says /ăl/. In multisyllabic words, the ending -al has a schwa sound and says /al/.
Example: final
A schwa /ə/ is a vowel sound similar to the short-u sound in up. It is found only in unaccented syllables of multisyllabic words.
(1) Below are some final syllables of List 15 words. Read them aloud to practice saying /a//.

In single-syllable words, the ending -ic has a short-i sound and says /ík/. In multisyllabic words, the ending -ic also has a short-i sound and says /ik/.
