

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Writing Supporting Details

Owning a Pet

Many families own pets and enjoy caring for them. The responsibilities of owning a pet are often shared by children and parents. There are some things to keep in mind when you open up your heart and home to a new pet.

First, decide what kind of pet to get. If you live in a small apartment, a large dog that needs room to run around is not the best choice. Dogs need to go on walks. If this is a job that you cannot commit to, then a pet that does not need walking would be better for your lifestyle. For example, a cat, a hamster, or fish are possibilities.

In order for a pet to stay healthy, it needs to get enough exercise. Pets also need the right kind and right amount of food. An animal's diet is usually also based on how large, how active, and how old it is. The wrong diet can make a pet overweight, lazy, or sick.

Most people agree that owning a pet involves a lot of work. But if you ask any pet owners, they will say it is well worth it!



Social Networking Tips

Social networking is a popular method for connecting with family and friends. You can make sure that the experience is a positive one by taking a few simple steps.

Safety All sites include safety features, such as passwords. Too many people use passwords that are simple to figure out, such as their birthday, pet's name, or address. The strongest passwords use a combination of characters: numbers, letters, and punctuation marks. Once you have a strong password, don't share it. Be sure to sign out of each site when you are finished.

Privacy Remember that the automatic setting for many sites is public—what you share online can be viewed by anyone. Most sites have privacy settings that you can change. The safest settings are those that allow only people you approve to view your posts. If you have trouble understanding the privacy settings, read the FAQ ("Frequently Asked Questions") section or contact a representative of the site to help you.

Verify Before you accept someone into your social-networking circle, be sure that he or she is someone you know and trust. Many sites encourage users to build networks with many connections, but it isn't always safe to let everyone in. In addition, double-check any files, photos, or videos before you download them. Some can damage your computer or can access your personal files.

Social networking sites keep people connected. They are an inexpensive, easy way to share details of your life with people you care about. But taking precautions to keep your account(s) safe, private, and protected are worth the time.
